LaTrisha A. Wilson, Esq.



LaTrisha Anita Wilson, affectionately known as “**Trisha**”, was born on February 18, 1964. A native New Yorker from Queens, Trisha was the youngest daughter of the late Elijah and Tillie Wilson. Upon graduation from Francis Lewis High School in Queens, New York, Trisha spent her undergraduate years at Syracuse University and continued her education at Georgetown University Law Center where she received her Juris Doctorate in 1988.

Upon graduation, she immediately delved into her field of study and climbed the legal career ladder. She began as a Law Clerk and later served as an Assistant District Attorney. She subsequently had great success as a principal attorney with the Departmental Disciplinary Committee. In that role, she investigated and prosecuted attorneys accused of misconduct. Her ultimate goal was to become a judge.

Following a diagnosis of ovarian cancer in February 2001, Trisha successfully battled three reoccurrences. As a result, she became an advocate and spokesperson for fellow ovarian cancer patients by joining the Ovarian Cancer Advisory Committee for Self Help for Women with Breast or Ovarian Cancer (SHARE), the Ovarian Cancer National Alliance (OCNA), Survivors Teaching Students and Saving Women’s Lives Program and as a Consumer Reviewer for the Scientific Peer Review Program for the Ovarian Cancer Research Program (OCRP). She even co-founded “In My Sisters’ Care,” an organization focused on narrowing the communication gap regarding ovarian cancer between patients, doctors, and the community at large. Her other community affiliations included: Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc. (Queens Alumnae Chapter); the Jamaica Queens Youth Council; parishioner at St. Paul Community Baptist Church; and an active board member of the Concerned Citizens of Laurelton.

Despite her extremely intense schedule she loved to read, travel, bargain shop and collect African- American dolls. Coming from a very close-knit family, her parents raised her to believe she could accomplish anything. They inspired her passion for knowledge and love for others. Her sisters, Audrey and Michelle, encouraged her to follow her dreams and desires. Trisha was exposed to new levels of love with the birth of her beloved niece, Keyanna, who affectionately called her “Aunty-Mom.”

Eligibility Requirements

- △ Candidate must have received acceptance to a law school, pursuing a Juris Doctorate degree and be enrolled at the time the scholarship award is given.

- △ Candidate must be of African-American, Caribbean-American, or African descent.

- △ Candidate must be a United States citizen or permanent United States Resident.

- △ Candidate must be a permanent resident of the borough of Queens but may attend school elsewhere.

- △ Candidate must complete an in-person interview with the Scholarship Committee.

- △ An **OFFICIAL SCHOOL TRANSCRIPT:**
Transcript must include the complete **SPRING 2023 TERM** and is due **Saturday, July 1, 2023.**
Official transcripts can be mailed in a sealed envelope or emailed directly to the Scholarship Committee from candidate's college/university.

- △ A five hundred (500) word personal statement which should include goals, accomplishments, community involvement, why you are pursuing a law degree and reasons why you should be considered for our scholarship.
- △ A small professional headshot or passport size picture of yourself.
